Mission

The mission of the Global Health Care Anti-Fraud Network (GHCAN) is to promote partnerships and communications between international organizations in order to reduce and eliminate health care fraud around the world. GHCAN aims to further this mission by:

- Raising awareness internationally about the issue of health care fraud
- Gathering and sharing information on the trends, issues, facts and figures relating to the problem
- Working cooperatively to improve international standards of practice around fraud prevention, detection, investigation and prosecution
- Developing National Health Care Anti-Fraud Association (based in the United States) expert training programs that are offered as joint educational efforts in order to bolster and prepare the world's health care anti-fraud professionals

About the Global Health Care Fraud Prevention Summit (The Summit)

On November 16-17, in San Diego, California, GHCAN will host the fifth Global Health Care Fraud Prevention Summit, inviting a variety of international stakeholders to network and discuss cooperation and best practices in the prevention, detection, investigation and prosecution of health care fraud. By bringing together international fraud leaders, GHCAN hopes to encourage strategic thinking about global health care fraud challenges, and lay the foundation for increased fraud awareness and cooperation internationally.

The Summit Format

The Summit will begin with general sessions highlighting over-arching global fraud prevention themes. It will then break down into small group discussions to encourage interaction and the flow of ideas and information among the participants. Also, an invitation-only evening reception and dinner will take place as a great networking opportunity.

Planned topics of discussion include:

- The role of organized crime in trans-national fraud schemes
- Counterfeit pharmaceuticals and other pharmaceutical issues
- International cooperation in information sharing and law enforcement

- Emerging fraud detection and prevention technology
- Emerging schemes in specific regions

The Summit Participation

We anticipate 100 Summit participants representing North America, Europe, South America, Asia, Africa and Australia. Participants will be identified and invited by the four hosting organizations.

The Canadian Health Care Anti-fraud Association (CHCAA) – Founded in 2000 to give a voice to the public and private sector health care organizations interested in preventing fraud in the Canadian health care environment. The CHCAA's Vision is to improve the Canadian Health Care environment by eliminating health care fraud and its Mission is to combat health care fraud and assist in restoring the integrity of the Canadian health care system. The Healthcare Forensic Management Unit (HFMU) - Under the banner of the Board of Healthcare Funders of Southern Africa as the representative body for medical schemes, the HFMU was launched in August 2003. The objective of the HFMU is to curb the incidences of fraud and other inappropriate behavior which contribute significantly to the cost spiral within the private healthcare funding industry. The HFMU does not only focus on the activities of healthcare providers but also those of employees of medical schemes and administrators, medical scheme members and brokers. The HFMU currently enjoys the participation of approximately 93% of the medical schemes industry as well as the support of regulatory bodies, statutory councils and professional associations. The Health Insurance Counter Fraud Group UK (HICFG) – HICFG is an industry initiative to prevent and detect fraud within health care and the health insurance industry within the United Kingdom. The HICFG membership consists of health insurance companies and is supported by the Association of British Insurers and participated by non-member attendees in the City of London Police and NHS Counter Fraud. The HICFG is dedicated to a professional, intelligence-based approach to minimizing fraud within private medical insurance and to advancing professional skills of industry-based counter fraud professionals.
